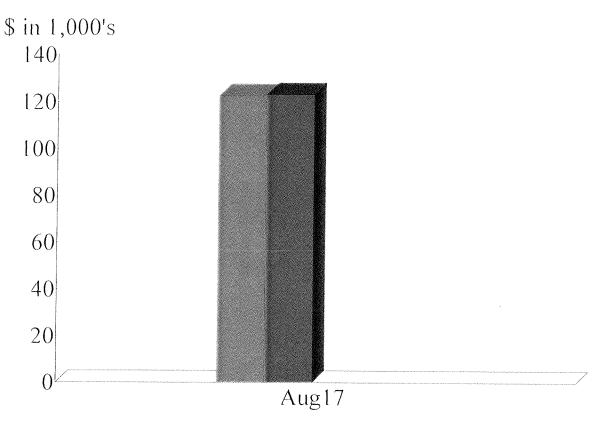

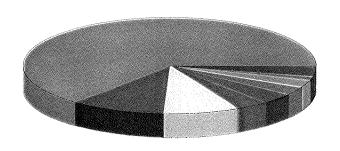

- 3. Attached is a second proposal for a new soft start to be installed on Well # 01 "Lebec Well". The proposal includes everything needed to install, test the soft start. Power Tech's proposal 2775.00, versus 1,965.68 from P&J ELECTRIC a difference of 809.32 dollars. "Please see attached"
- **4.** Back Hoe, out riggers are leaking very badly, with the left one being the worst of the two, operators are looking for the approval of the board to repair the hydraulic piston or pistons, depending on rather repairing both is approved.
- 5. Water Treatment Certification Review Grades 1-2 Palmdale, October 4-5, 2017. CRWA is offering a series of two-day classes designed to pretest, and detailed instruction on the expected range of knowledge for water treatment operators. This course is very beneficial, for passing the state exam. Only Jeff Bryan is in need of this course, and certification may be needed if the State choose a blending method of the wells due to water quality. Cost of this two-day class is 350.00 \$ plus his time, and use of the company truck. "Please see attached"
- 6. On call compensation is a subject yet to be discussed. Last meeting the board approved to remove overtime. This overtime was Lebec County Water Districts on call compensation. As it stands operators are subject to being on call, on standby in case of emergencies 3-4 days a week, with the fourth day rotating every other week. Operators are no longer being compensated for being on call. It is a practice of all known water companies to compensate their employees for being on call. With that said, I would ask the board to revisit company policy, and determine a reasonable compensation for its present and future employees for this time, with a written-on call policy, once agreed upon, this compensation should be retroactive to a time when this compensation was revoked.

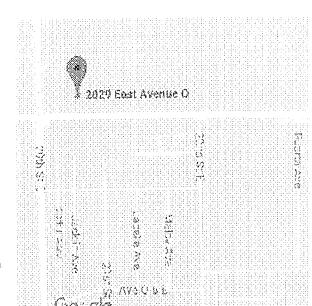

To whom it may concern:

Provost & Prichard Consulting Group represents the Lebec County Water District (District) in a State of California Safe Drinking Water SRF Planning Grant. The District is seeking a site for a new drinking water well. The District is interested in a well site near the Tejon Pass Safety Roadside Rest Area (northbound side I-5) on Caltrans property. The Rest Area is located within the District boundary and the District supplies water to the Rest Area.

After drilling an unsuccessful test well in Lebec on the west side of I-5, the District's hydrogeologist, Kenneth Schmidt and Associates, reviewed alternative well sites within the District boundary. A site east of I-5 at the subject rest area is believed to have the best potential to provide both the quantity and quality water desired. The new well would replace an existing well that is contaminated with fluoride and uranium.

The District is seeking permission and access to drill and subsequently abandon and destroy a test well. If the test well is determined to provide good water quality and meets the minimum desired well yield, the District will seek an easement, license or purchase of the property for the construction and operation of a permanent water well and related facilities. If the water produced by the well meets all drinking water standards, a site of about 10,000 to 15,000 square feet will be needed. If it is determined that well head treatment is required, a site of about 20,000 square feet may be required. The District will complete the required CEQA documents. A Notice of Exemption will be filed for the test well. If the site is determined to be suitable for a permanent well, the District will complete the required CEQA documents before a permanent well is drilled.

The proposed well site is shown in the attached Exhibit A. The site is a portion of APN 255-540-50, Kern County. The site is proposed to be accessed directly from the service road on the southwest side of the Rest Area truck parking area. The District will require an access easement and year-round access to the well site. The area of interest is currently graded and clear of vegetation and does not appear to have any permanent use. The District would consider other locations within the parcel if necessary to meet Caltrans needs. Photos showing the area of interest are included in the email for your information.

Please review this proposal and provide the District guidance on how rights to drill on the subject property can be obtained and the approximate time frame to receive approval to drill the test well. The District is only interested if drilling the test well if rights to drill and operate a permanent well can be obtained. The District is under an extreme time schedule to complete a

test well. We are requesting that you expedite your review so that the District can proceed immediately with the project.

We are willing to meet with you at your pleasure to help expedite the review process.

Thank you for your assistance. We are looking forward to your response.

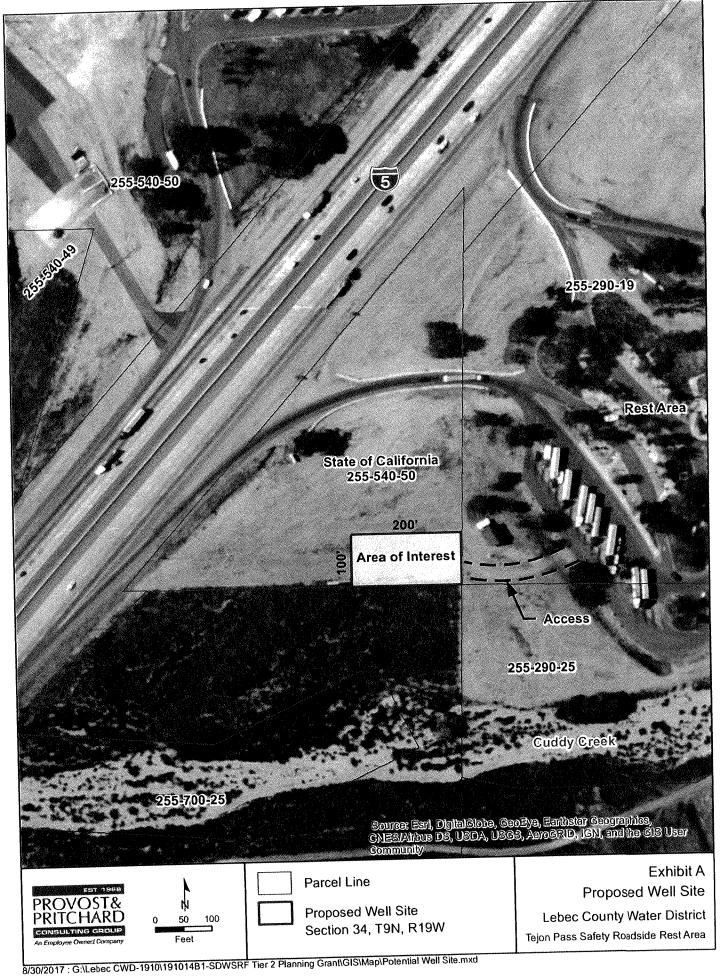

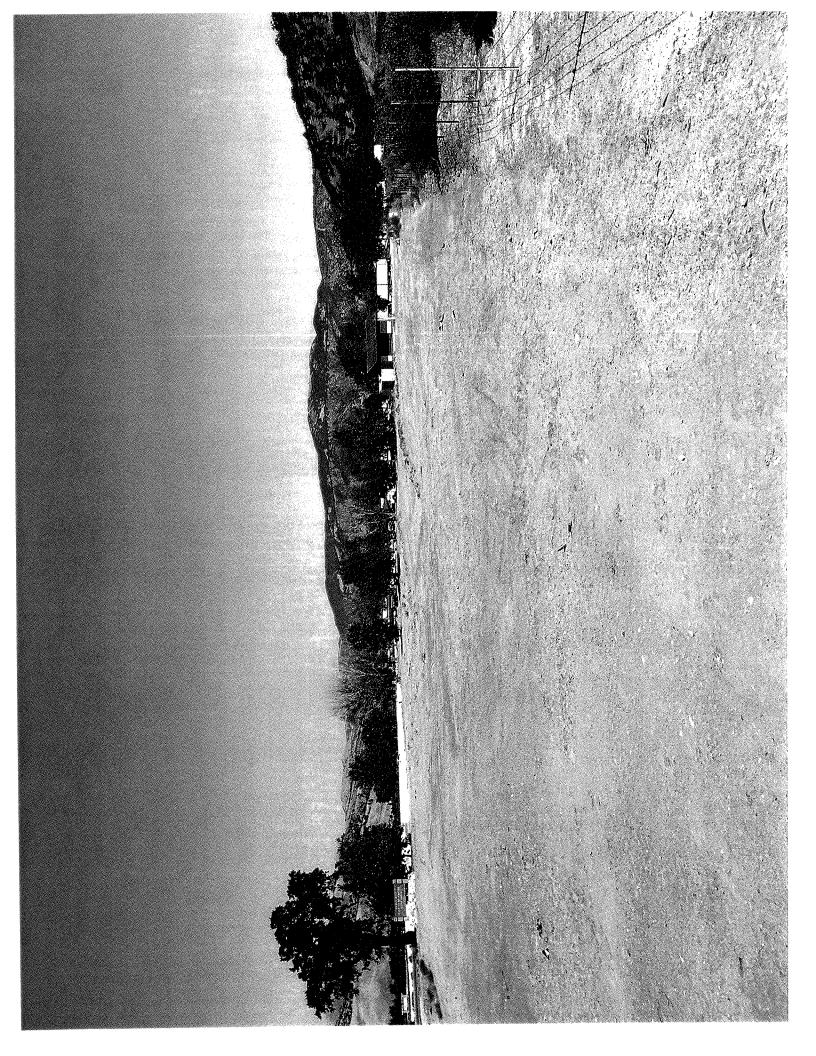

- (h) If no GSA with overlapping boundaries is filed, the Castac Lake GSA will take effect 90 days after DWR posts the GSA formation notice online (CWC §10723.8(c)).

This is Hanna with the ILG. Please see below information about Key Pad Polling devices. Clickers are available to borrow in September.

..e have 92 KeyPad Polling Devices (or clickers) available. The process of borrowing the clickers is:

- Make availability request via email (include the date of the meeting, the number of clickers needed, the date that you need receive the clickers, and equipment return date). You would email me.
- Sign the agreement (I will email it to you once I received your availability request email)
- Provide FedEx/UPS account information and shipping address. The cost to ship 92 clickers one way is around \$35 plus \$3.50 for a pickup.

You can reserve clickers several months in advance. You ship the clickers back after the meeting. We can discuss the situation where you need the clickers for a series of consecutive meetings (depending on availability).

About the KeyPad Polling Devices (also known as Audience Response System):

Clickers it is a useful way to receive and share participants' opinions. Each participant records their choice using a handheld keypad, which then transmits the information to a laptop computer that tabulates the responses and quickly produces an easy-to-read graph of the aggregated data. When combined with dialogue, this technology allows participants to anonymously select or prioritize options and then instantly view the group's collective judgment.

Clickers are easy to set up and use. We include step by step installation instructions. No internet is quired to use them. Polling slides are easily embedded into PowerPoint Presentation.

Another alternative to clickers is <u>MeetingSift</u>. It is an online polling platform that is also easy to use. To use meeting sift, participants will need their smartphones as well as personal phone data plans and/or wi-fi in the room. There are free and subscription-based versions.
